## 5. PUBLIC COMMENT

Darlene Vaughn inquired about the buses to Manteca and the bus passes.

Linda DeGuzman thanked RTD staff for addressing her concerns about the bus lifts and providing her with schedules and maps for the Route 40. It helps her understand the routes better.

Noreen Byrne commented on the proposed award of contract to MV.

Alan Wagner commented about budget problems around California, the proposed award of contract to MV, and possible negotiations with the new contractor.

Mark Cain commented on the proposed contract award to MV.

Sarah Walter commented about not being a number on a paper, her job, and the proposed contract award to MV.

Sean Reilly commented on MV's services and proposed contract award to MV.

Vince Contino represented the Union employees and spoke about their hard work for RTD. He also commented on the proposed contract award to MV and the negotiation of a fair, equitable, and honest agreement.

MV Transportation Senior Vice President W.C. Pihl assured RTD employees that if MV is awarded the contract for County Transportation Services, MV staff will be immediately available to begin a smooth transition of services. He said that MV does intend to recognize the Union and negotiate a fair and equitable agreement. He mentioned that MV values and needs the experience of RTD employees to be successful. He also assured that members who join MV will not see a severe reduction in wages and benefits. MV would like to partner with RTD, the Union, and the passengers that MV will be serving. If the contract is awarded to MV, MV will continue to provide excellent service and find ways to work together to even improve service.

MV Director of Labor Relations for Western Region David Vinson commented that he has negotiated over 40 collective bargaining agreements and is also a retired president of the Teamsters Union. Mr. Vinson was hired by MV to build bridges to labor. He confirmed that MV has every intention of obtaining the experience of RTD drivers, looks forward to a smooth transition, and bargaining in good faith under the terms of the National Labor Relations Act.

Loren Faria commented on the proposed contract award to MV and inquired whether MV would provide the same level of service as RTD.

The General Manager/CEO provided the following information:

• 19<sup>th</sup> Annual Mineta Transportation Institute Banquet – RTD's Planning Manager Nathaniel Atherstone graduated with his master's degree at that ceremony.

- Goodwill Donation Drive Goodwill Industries has been struggling with a
  downturn in its donations. RTD developed a partnership with Goodwill
  Industries and has conducted two donation drives on its behalf. RTD
  employees participated by bringing their donated goods. RTD hopes to
  continue its partnership with Goodwill Industries by conducting additional
  drives.
- B. Legislative Report At 10:00 a.m. EST, Department of Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood announced to Congress in Washington, DC the award winners for a specific grant program. At 10:00 a.m. PST, the Deputy Administrator was at RTD with Congressman Cardoza and Congressman McNerney to announce that RTD was the winner of one of those grants. RTD was awarded over 5.2 million dollars for the Hammer Lane BRT Corridor Project. A total of 281 applications were filed nationwide for this funding opportunity. Only \$162 million dollars were available to give away. RTD was 1 out of 47 applications that were awarded and RTD also received one of the largest awards. Thanks to the Grants Department Grant Analyst George Lorente and Grants Senior Specialist Tammy Kramp for working on the grant, submitting it on time and in a complete manner so RTD could successfully win that award.

Chair Giovanetti inquired about the Community Challenge Planning Grant with City of Stockton and for RTD to consider applying for that grant.
